



# CORDELIA, MEIN KIND

**JULY 16 - JULY 20** 



Inspired by Shakespeare's King Lear and The Yiddish King Lear, Cordelia, Mein Kind is a unique performance work that combines original interviews between a contemporary Cordelia and her father, (a Yiddish-speak) Holocaust survivor living in 'exile' in Melbourne), and other visual imagery, with a language that is gestural, poetic, direct and physical.

Bold, audacious and intensely personal, it probes beneath the surface, exploding Cordelia's silence to divulge a psychological inheritance and an emotional core linked to her father's trauma – his history passed on to her - a history of exile and loss.



Continuous (pronounced Rén in Mandarin and Hito in Japanese, means human/person) is an identity struggle that explores dislocation and mocks the absurdity of "assimilation".

Whilst based on the human experience of the 'outsider',  $\bigwedge$  is an abstract conversation around notions of 'foreignness' and 'self'.

Forced to confront her gender and race the performer attempts to physically articulate the experience of a modern, white woman living as a minority within ancient cultures. Following one woman's story this work is a personal reflection of the migratory experience.

As the first solo work created by writer, director and installation artist, Ren Flannery,  $\bigwedge$  is an experimentation of ideas discovered through Clown and Butoh, presented through a language free form.


















# THE OUTCASTE WEAKLY POET STAGE SHOW

In 1938, Elizabeth Smart, browsing in a bookshop in London, discovered George Barker's poetry, determined to marry him, and began raising the funds to bring him to her home in Canada. George and Jessica Barker arrived at the bus stop in June 1940. Elizabeth Smart was there to pick them up.

We Were Almost Entirely Happy is an exploration of Elizabeth Smart's By Grand Central Station I Sat Down and Wept (1945), and George Barker's The Dead Seagull (1950). In each, Smart and Barker detail a 'fictional' account of their life-long love-affair.

I was writing about one thing: the emotion felt by a woman in love.

# HENRY / ENRICO IV

#### SEPTEMBER 4 - SEPTEMBER 14

A two acts tragicomedy in English and Italian .

Henry IV is a play about the process of time, its relativity, and its constant and unstoppable passing. It is also about a man's most critical experience of time's passing / aging. The process of growing old - of becoming a series of other persons - physically as well as psychologically, of remembering what one once looked like and acted like. The fixity of one's image in the past (as represented concretely by the paintings of Henry and Matilda) is contrasted with the change of image in the present, including the use of makeup in a futile attempt to stop the change of time and make life conform to the image of the past.
