If theatre is not your mental disease, you are not a real theatre artist. The theatre like a bog, once you step there it is forever, it is incurable.

What is a poem worth uses direct reporting of poetry value from the Melbourne poetry community and the author's own responses to produce a multi-voiced reading of results. Driven by the rhythmic insistence of Whitman, Ginsberg and Australian bush balladry, it explores the human experience of access to value, to being of value. It is more poem than play, more play than recitation. It celebrates the call of the page, the voice of poetry, the sounds of answers.


