MISSION, FUNDAMENTAL PURPOSE, VALUES

LA MAMA THEATRE: FACILITATING FEARLESSLY INDEPENDENT THEATRE MAKING

With a rich history spanning over 50 years and a national profile, La Mama is Australia's home of independent theatre. It plays a critical role in the national arts landscape as a place for responsive, new, risk-taking work to occur. La Mama has a distinct artist focus and provides a unique audience experience. Treasured for its continued advocacy of those seeking to explore beyond the mainstream, La Mama champions artistic individuality and freedom, prioritises accessibility and celebrates a diverse community of artists and audiences alike. Providing the integral foundational resources and support for both new and experienced theatre makers, La Mama celebrates creative risk and pedestals the development of new Australian work whilst ensuring artist renumeration.

Our model provides each production with the theatre venue at no cost, a cash budget, 80% of box office and ticketing, front-of-house, marketing and technical support infrastructure to allow artists to focus on their art. This continues to be an attractive and rare proposition to artists at all stages of their career, and is in increasing demand. What La Mama offers independent artists is unique in Australia and we have existed for more than fifty years because there continues to be a great need for what we do.

La Mama is an open, accessible space, actively breaking down barriers to the arts through programs, initiatives, affordable ticketing and a welcoming ethos that has developed over the past five decades. La Mama is home to many and open to all. **Our Mission** is to discover, uncover, and provide a platform for new voices and ideas through theatre and art.

Our Fundamental Purpose is to provide independent artists from across Australia with opportunities to develop, practice and present work, by:

- **Enabling art making:** Our unique programming and presentation model provides artistic teams with a production budget, full 'no-rent' venue access, marketing, ticketing, front of house, technical support and 80% box office return, allowing artists to focus on making art.
- **Enhancing opportunities for artists:** Our programs support artists in Presentation, Creation, Outreach, Festivals, Engagement and Multi-arts.
- **Empowering artistic freedom:** As a hub for truly independent theatre in Australia, our commitment to minimal intervention in the creative process supports artistic risk and freedom.
- **Engaging audiences as a community:** We offer an affordable and hospitable cultural experience that appeals to a broad range of people.
- **Equipping independent artists with skills to thrive:** We provide services to independent artists including: script appraisal, industry advice, advocacy, sharing opportunities and a space to connect, reflect, develop and create.

Values:

- Artistic Freedom: We do not impose artistic parameters.
- Artist Driven: Artists are at the core of our programming, programs and pathway opportunities.
- **Theatre for All:** We value participation and inclusivity for all (artists and audiences alike).
- **Diversity at Our Core:** Works by First Nations artists, artists with a disability, artists from all cultures, ages and genders are not labeled 'diverse', they are celebrated, championed and regularly programmed.
- **Celebrating Creativity:** We encourage exciting, adventurous, intimate, ambitious, risk-taking theatre and art.

CEO REPORT

Our major focus in 2019, apart from our artistic program, was REBUILD La Mama.

This was two pronged: The fundraising program for which we employed the highly effective Tim Stitz.The aim of this was to raise the \$3 million plus we needed to realise our dreams; the second prong was the very creative design process which was realised in collaboration with our very talented architect Meg White, backed by the firm Cottee Parker. Caitlin Dullard is the overall Project Coordinator.

In this process we were quite overwhelmed by the generosity of our community, the philanthropic sector and our state government in contributing to our fundraising target, and the in-kind generosity of those people involved in the design of the rebuild. In November we had a "turning the sod" ceremony with Minister Martin Foley, the Philanthropic Alliance: Gandel Philanthropy, John T Reid Charitable Trusts, Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation, Sidney Myer Fund and one anonymous donor, as well as the Hugh Williamson Foundation and our community of 600+ donors (see page 84 for details).

Artistically our commitment was to facilitate the program articulated in 2018 before the ravages of the May 19th fire! All our primary productions were performed in the La Mama Courthouse, which also housed our very cramped staff quarters.

We took part in both the MIDSUMMA

COMEDY festivals and as usual. but also YIRRAMBOI First Nation's festival, collaborating with ILBIJERRI in presenting Jack Sheppard's dark and magnificent The Honouring. We presented our acclaimed Uncle Vanya in the 2019 ADELAIDE FESTIVAL in this sixth year of its production at the historic residence of Hans Heysen, The Cedars in Hahndorf (presented in association with La Trobe University). We also participated in the FRINGE FESTIVAL with two of our much respected alumni Richard Murphet directing Tony Reck's Broken River and Jenny Kemp directing Facing Medea.

Three of our productions were on the VCE syllabus: the Commedia dell'Arte *Pinocchio*; an adaptation of the American classic *The Yellow Wallpaper* and Rosie John's *Tchekov at the House of Special Purpose*. In July we also presented our ENCORE season of Peta Hanrahan's adaptation of *A Room of One's Own* at fortyfivedownstairs.

An absolute highlight of our artistic year was the brilliant Bagryana Popov directed season of Samah Sabawi's play *THEM*. This was nominated for Green Room Awards in Writing, Direction, Production and Ensemble work, winning the prize for Writing. It is scheduled to have a season at the Arts Centre in the future. We also acknowledge the Green Room Nominations for When The Light Leaves (Writing) and The Intriguing Case of the Silent Forest (Lighting).

In our Primary Season we presented 30 works to over 12,500 audience.

We also held 18 rehearsed Playreadings, and continued our La Mama Musica and Poetica programs, farewelling long-term Musica Curator Annabel Warmington and welcoming Gemma Hornbury into the role.

Thank you to Pippa Bainbridge and Swiss Kalken at THE BURROW for hosting our EXPLORATIONS season, including 19 works in development. Many of these have gone on to be programmed at La Mama and elsewhere, and *Happy-Go-Wrong* went straight onto an acclaimed season in Fringe 2019. We also partnered with Brunswick Neighbourhood House to present three performances and for the first time travelled to Portarlington, Deans Marsh, Taradale and Stawell for our La Mama Mobile production of Jennifer Monk's *To Lonely With Love*. We were delighted to work with Mainteatre in Bandung Indonesia to present the bilingual work *Hades Fading*.

We were proud to work with Melbourne University in launching the La Mama archives digitally and thank long-term staff member Fiona Wiseman for her work in achieving this goal. We also thank staff members Jen Tran, Xanthe Beesley and Tim Stitz who played a significant role and finished their time at La Mama in 2019.

Finally, we were humbled by the industry recognition as our Co-CEO and Artistic Director, Liz Jones AO, was awarded the **Sue Natrass Helpmann Award** for exceptional service to the live performance industry, our Co-CEO and Manager/Producer, Caitlin Dullard, was awarded the **Geoffrey Milne Green Room Award** for her outstanding contribution to independent theatre and our Chair, Richard Watts, was awarded the **Sidney Myer Facilitator's Prize**.

We thank our whole community for their ongoing support and can't wait to see you back at our old home on Faraday street in 2021.

COMMUNICATIONS REPORT

INTRODUCTION

La Mama's 2019 marketing team supported artists to promote their work, promoted the La Mama brand and continued to connect with our existing audiences. We gained insight into new audience possibilities and saw new audiences engage both online and in the theatre. We had some staffing changes, we launched a new website, we increased engagement on all social media platforms, we had a rise in media coverage both locally and nationally, we rolled out new initiatives to support artists, we supported the marketing and communication of a successful fundraising campaign and we built stronger connections with our industry.

ARTIST RESOURCES

All artists at La Mama are supported with the marketing of their shows. Firstly, we provide all producers and artists with a marketing pack. The pack is used to inform artists about what La Mama can offer in regards to marketing their show, what they are expected to do and some handy tips to encourage artists to drive their own marketing plan. This pack has grown into a great resource and valuable tool for artists presenting work at La Mama.

Support we offered artists and producers to market their work at La Mama in 2019:

- **Marketing meetings** give the creative teams and the La Mama team a chance to connect in person. It gives a face to face approach to convey some finer details of the marketing information.
- Media releases are developed with artists and sent out 6 weeks before all 'main season' shows to Media (print, radio, online), key theatre personnel, funding bodies, award panellists, independent artists, La Mama Board Members and other VIPs. This broadens the reach and chance for further opportunity for productions.
- **Paid advertising** in *Beat Magazine* at no charge to the artists
- Free photography / marketing images were offered by professional photographer Darren Gill. This initiative has given artists the opportunity to have high quality marketing images for their productions. In 2019 we had 13 productions take this offer up. Thigh Gap's image by Darren Gill was picked up by The Music; Fashion Journal to use for the cover of

their arts section in the November edition. This was great exposure for a young playwright to receive.

- **Free Design** is provided in the form of print marketing, programs and online marketing content.
- **TodayTix** ticket platform was trialled in 2019. It resulted in selling 61 tickets to various La Mama productions. The most purchased show on TodayTix was *Thigh Gap*. This platform has given a great opportunity for both artists and La Mama to gain new audiences.





Introduction

La Mama's overall finances are contained within three separate entities: La Mama Inc, La Mama Trust and La Mama Trust 2. Please see a summary below and audited accounts for each body in the pages following.

LA MAMA INC. is an incorporated association and a registered charity.

- La Mama General (Operations)
- La Mama Box Office (Box Office only. 80% belongs to artists)
- La Mama Long Service Account (Restricted reserves for LSL)

LA MAMA TRUST is registered for DGR status.

- · La Mama Reserves (For the long-term investment of La Mama)
- La Mama Trust (Reserves used for operations.)

LA MAMA TRUST 2 (LA MAMA HOLDINGS) is the land and building at 205 Faraday Street.

• La Mama Rebuild (Only for the La Mama building)

Despite a difficult year of regeneration, La Mama finished 2019 in a stable financial position having achieved a remarkable fundraising goal. Throughout 2019, La Mama received donations for the rebuild on Faraday street, which financially activated La Mama Trust 2 (the entity that owns the building) for the first time since 2008. Many of these donations were processed through the La Mama Trust which is reflected in the entity's unusual activity this year, however overall it's financial position remained unchanged. La Mama Inc. finished with a surplus of \$31,193.
