ABOUT LA MAMA

With a rich history spanning over 50 years and a national profile. La Mama is Australia's home of independent theatre. It plays a critical role in the national arts landscape as a place for responsive. new, risk-taking work to occur. La Mama has a distinct artist focus and provides a unique audience experience. Treasured for its continued advocacy of those seeking to explore beyond the mainstream. La Mama champions artistic individuality and freedom, prioritises accessibility and celebrates a diverse community of artists and audiences alike. Providing the integral foundational resources and support for both new and experienced theatre makers. La Mama ensures artist renumeration, celebrates creative risk and vigorously advocates the development of new Australian work

Our model provides each production with the theatre venue at no cost, a modest cash budget, 80% of box office, and ticketing, front-of-house, marketing and technical support infrastructure to allow artists to focus on their art.

Synonymous with this cultural icon is the small, intensely intimate setting within which performance takes place. In La Mama, both artists and audiences are challenged and invigorated by the knowledge that there is nowhere to hide, no whisper that will not carry, no movement that won't be studied for meaning. The uniquely raw and immediate quality of La Mama is revered by both artists and audiences, and provides a powerful learning experience for actors, directors, writers, designers and choreographers, which will travel with them wherever they go.

Over half a century, La Mama has presented nearly 2,500 shows, and each year we become

more jam-packed than the last. We now average approximately 50 primary seasons annually, as well as developments, monthly Musica and Poetica events, regular touring through our Mobile program, plus our Learning productions, play readings, and our accessible and special events (forums, launches, public celebrations, etcetera).

La Mama's core mission is to provide independent artists from across Australia with opportunities to develop practice and present work. We do this through providing extensive services, including: rehearsal space, administrative services, a free script appraisal service, casting advice, opportunities to volunteer, work experience, internships and mentor programs, industry advice, advocacy, and the space for professional and personal development.

Sadly our home in Faraday street burned down in May 2019. We are in the process of rebuilding and we reopen there in 2021. Until then, our home is at La Mama Courthouse on Drummond Street.

La Mama is an open, accessible space, actively breaking down barriers to the arts through programs, initiatives, affordable ticketing and a welcoming ethos that has developed over the past five decades. La Mama is home to many and open to all.

WELCOME

WELCOME TO OUR SUMMER AND AUTUMN SEASONS 2020

The rebuild will commence very early in 2020. Caitlin Dullard will be Project Manager, Meg White architect (assisted by Cottee-Parker) and local firm Chroma will be our builders. We are all very excited by this prospect and relieved that we have raised the required capital to start.

Meanwhile back at the La Mama Courthouse it will be business as usual (but faster than usual!).

We begin the year with the MIDSUMMA Festival with two new play works and the wonderful Homophonic musical evenings that have been happening at La Mama for nearly a decadel This will be followed by the AsiaTOPA Festival with two new works and the International COMEDY Festival with four new works. In February Unsuckle and Rehearsal for Death come to us after successful Explorations seasons, we have two VCE seasons and in April Hedda GablerGablerGabler straight from its 2019 VCA Masters of Directing season.

We bring back works by La Mama doyens Lloyd Jones and Mammad Aidani plus a new work by Jim Daly. Michel Tuomy's *Little Brother, Big Sister*, Hayley Lawson-Smith's *The Tom* and Madeliane Nunn's *Cactus* are all plays that have come to us unsolicited through our script appraisal process and are now making their debut seasons. They are very strong works.

Max Subra is bringing us the contentious story of Dan Kelly's survival in *Kelly* and Elena Mazzon's study of the life of Clara Schumann comes to us acclaimed from the world! We will present two La Mama Poeticas and two La Mama Musicas in this programme and introduce you to the new La Mama Cabaretica curated by Susan Bamford-Caleo and Isobel Knight. We also have two shows on the road with our La Mama Mobile program, Jennifer Monk's *Ladies of the Bay*, and James Hazelden's *Mystery Radio Theatre*.

What a packed season. And all but the two VCE productions have ONE week seasons only so you must be on your veritable toes or you will miss the wonders presented. This has been necessitated by the need to limit ourselves to one venue while the rebuild is taking place. It also means our vital EXPLORATIONS SEASON will have to be postponed to 2021.

Thank you so much to everyone who made 2019 such a pleasure: artists, audience, donors large and small, regular workers, volunteers and those from the government and philanthropic sectors who have all contributed so much!

And particular thanks to Xanthe Beesley and Tim Stitz whose extra support in the challenging past year has been greatly appreciated.

We all look forward to greeting your at the La Mama Courthouse in the coming months.



LITTLE BROTHER, BIG SISTER

On the brink of artistic discovery, Michel's plans for the future are interrupted by a diagnosis of schizophrenia. He must rely on his sister - yet Karen has dreams of her own. How long can she push them aside to care for him?




