With a rich history spanning over 50 years and a national profile, La Mama is Australia's home of independent theatre. It plays a critical role in the national arts landscape as a place for responsive, new, risk-taking work to occur. La Mama has a distinct artist focus and provides a unique audience experience. Treasured for its continued advocacy of those seeking to explore beyond the mainstream, La Mama champions artistic individuality and freedom, prioritises accessibility and celebrates a diverse community of artists and audiences alike. Providing the integral foundational resources and support for both new and experienced theatre makers, La Mama ensures artist remuneration, celebrates creative risk and vigorously advocates the development of new Australian work.

Over half a century, La Mama has presented nearly 2,500 shows, and each year we become more jampacked than the last. We now average approximately 50 primary seasons annually, as well as developments, seasonal La Mamica events (Musica, Poetica, Cabaretica), regular touring through our Mobile program, plus our Learning productions, La Mama for Kids program, play readings, and our accessible and special events (forums, launches, public celebrations, etcetera).

## PLAYREADINGS OUR HALF OF THE SKY

The least cryptic thing uttered by Mao Zedong -"Women hold up half the sky"- was inspiration to Peter Green for this 50 minute performance in text, music and lyrics.

Last Illuminations explores the extent to which we can live within our imagination and memory through focussing on a public servant who is experiencing something like visions.




