With a rich history spanning over 50 years and a national profile, La Mama is Australia's home of independent theatre. It plays a critical role in the national arts landscape as a place for responsive, new, risk-taking work to occur. La Mama has a distinct artist focus and provides a unique audience experience. Treasured for its continued advocacy of those seeking to explore beyond the mainstream, La Mama champions artistic individuality and freedom, prioritises accessibility and celebrates a diverse community of artists and audiences alike. Providing the integral foundational resources and support for both new and experienced theatre makers, La Mama ensures artist remuneration, celebrates creative risk and vigorously advocates the development of new Australian work.

Over half a century, La Mama has presented nearly 2,500 shows, and each year we become more jampacked than the last. 
With all of this we will also be having our usual performances of La Mama POETICA, MUSICA, CABARETICA and KIDS and PLAYREADINGS.

ALL THAT FALL



'I suppose you wouldn't be in need of a small load of dung?'

In 'All That Fall', we find that even with despair nipping at our heels, laughter can triumph over the absurdity of life.

Written for radio in 1956, Beckett's language and sound text conjures the unpredictable Mrs Rooney, and eccentric characters from her village, as she drags her feet to the train station to meet her husband - they have grown to understand 'How To Be Happy though Married'. In this staged production, timeworn everyday objects become soundmakers.
